Deaths

- A death doesn't have to be sensational to be picked up by the A.P.
- Probate notices can run for many years. Estate papers were filed every year until minor children reached adulthood or married, then estates could be closed.
- Mortuary or death notices typically ran weekly announcing deaths from the previous week. Typically, name, date of

- death and address only
- Cards of Thanks are from families thanking friends for their support during their difficult time.
- Year-in-review columns save you time. Look for the last issue of the year, or first issue of the year.

Tips and Tricks

- Use family & friends as additional sources of information
- Check the newspapers where relatives lived. They would often report on the deaths of family members
- Use newspaper articles about events (accidents, military incursions etc...) You
 might not find your ancestor listed by name, but you can fill in pertinent details
 of the experience for your family history
- Cast a wider net! Sensational events were often picked up by the A.P. and other news agencies and run across the country. Don't rule out 'search hits' in other states if they match your timeline.
- Don't limit your search to within the years your ancestor lived. There are many reasons they may appear in papers after they died.
